

INTRODUCTION

The Shelby County Comprehensive Plan is a planning document prepared and adopted by the citizens and officials of Shelby County and its cities. This plan is intended to provide a long range guide for the public and private sectors of the County and its urban areas.

The Plan consists of the following basic elements as required by the Kentucky Revised Statutes:

1. A statement of Goals and Objectives;
2. A Land Use Plan;
3. A Transportation Plan; and
4. A Community Facilities Plan.

Research requirements of a Comprehensive Plan include the following:

1. Population Analysis;
2. Economic Survey and Analysis;
3. Analyses of Land and Building Use, Transportation, and Community Facilities; and
4. Other Analyses and Elements that the Planning Commission deems appropriate to be included in the Comprehensive Plan.

The Triple S Planning Commission of Shelby County is charged with the responsibility of developing, reviewing and updating the Comprehensive Plan.

Reviews must be conducted at least every five years to insure that the Plan is kept current with the community needs and desires.

This Comprehensive Plan provides only guidance for the development of Shelby County through the year 2020. This Plan supersedes previous Comprehensive Plans for Shelby County prepared by the Triple S Planning Commission in 1998.
